The 'why' prevention idea was from Syler because of an experience he had at Idaho Drug Free Youth's (iDFY) leadership academy. (Syler) During iDFY one night everyone in our cabin shared why they were dedicated to a drug-free life, and I thought it was cool hearing what everyone had to say and hear about their personal experiences. (Hailey) MADC's <u>Mission and Vision</u> . <u>Strategic Prevention Framework</u> (SPF) Model: Action Areas. Assessment, Capacity, Planning, Implementation, Evaluation, Sustainability & Cultural Competence. Data driven prevention: drugs of focus and data sources. Now we'll share what our goals are and why we choose to be active in prevention. I'll share Kendall's on her behalf. Her goals this year are increase use and sharing of prevention related data, enhance evaluation of programs and strategies, and increase parent buy-in and involvement. My goals are CEC Sector Representative highlight videos, Hidden in Plain Sight trailer use / streamlining, and more youth involvement. Now moving on to the Sector Representatives. As a reminder there are 12 sectors represented on the Executive Committee, the Coalition Involvement Agreement is reviewed annually, and the CIAs align with the West Ada School District academic calendar. Currently the only open sector is Healthcare which is defined as an individual legally allowed to provide physical, mental, or behavioral healthcare services. We have a couple of people in

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Goals for 2025: are to help engage youth in prevention on behalf of Region 4 Behavioral Health Board and MADC and assist with identifying a speaker for Recovery Breakfast. (Caylee) Goals for 2025: are to attend more events during the Spring and the beginning of the school year. And would like to look for opportunities to expand iDFY in Meridian. Also wants to continue to present in the classroom, at the middle schools. (Jordan) Goals for 2025: are more involved in communication and become more involved in MADC initiatives. Would like to use her skills in messaging and media to help expand coalition's reach. (Kati) Goals for 2025: highlight drug use and mental health (upstream family focus), advocate for more government investments in prevention, and advocate for youth diversion. (Hailey) I'll share Robert's on his behalf: his goals are teach in more classes at Mountain View HS and to teach to all incoming freshman. (Anne) Goals for 2025: help run the MADC table at the Northwest Alcohol conference. And help identify a member of the business community to fill the SR role, someone that would be a better fit. (Hailey) Brenda's goals for 2025 are to volunteer at more events with MADC, more advocacy work, and involvement with initiatives within the school and police department. Earl's goals for 2025 are newsletter involvement within the schools, hoping to have a topic once a month starting next school year. Susie's goals for 2025 are to increase youth involvement in Elk's initiatives (hoop shoot, boy scout badge, video and poster contest) and to gather donations for HIPS trailer from Tall Cop. (Yoonwa) Tiffany's and I goals for 2025 is to have MADC at Counselor Kickoff Meeting, collab with Hidden in Plain Sight Trailer and WASD and work on graphics for school newsletters / 'toilet talks.' (Jake) Goals for 2025: would like to assist in "On-boarding" new Faith sector Rep. Find a location for the Recovery Breakfast. Incorporate MADC in activities in the Mayor's office. My why prevention comes from being involved in sports and watching how addiction can be devasting to people. I recommend a book called Baseball Cop, which is a book about drug use in the baseball world. (Hailey) MADC Strategic Planning is an ongoing process. We are constantly identifying gaps and needs through data assessment and data analysis. The next step is to determine which prevention strategies your goals align with and plan from implementation. 3:40	Any Additional CEC Business Updates Discussion	(Kati) Would like to enhance CATCH My Breath (CMB) by aiding Drug Prevention		
		Counselors in WASD. CDH provided stats to WASD which showed there was 40% less		
		violations this year since CMB has been implemented. Would like to set up a meeting		
		and plan of action. Hailey, I would like you to be involved in this as well. Would like to		
		know: what are the schools doing about the vaping problem? I sent information		
		regarding peer-to-peer teaching to Lori Frasure, and she sent information to Dr. Bub.		
		Hoping to create a plan of action and get the high schools on board. (Hailey) Would		
		love to be looped in on this. Our entire SRO team is trained and is ready to go so let us		
		know how we can help and get involved. I have also seen where high school students		
		are trained in CMB and teach to middle schoolers I think that would be great to		
		implement as well. (Caylee) Would like to teach in the middle schools and would be		
		open to teaching CMB. (Yoonwa) WASD is on board with this and CMB is working. We		
		are interesting in the SROs teaching this. So if it's in one school it should be in all		
		schools. (Kati) How long do they teach the tobacco unit? Are they picking and pulling		
		information from the CMB presentation to use? (Yoonwa) 9 th and 10 th graders, and		
		they don't have a lot of time typically. (Caylee) Maybe teaching that portion during		
		the Freshman cornerstone at the beginning of the year. Promoting <i>iDFY's Youth</i>		
		Summit in June. Mahrika has a plan for a 'Chapter's model' for groups within different		
		schools to share information. This helps plan leadership skills and empowers them to		
		implement what they've learned in the community. I am unable to attend the summit		
		this year but am sharing it for others. (Kati) CDH has 6 scholarships available. (Hailey)		
		There is one iDFY charter locally, at Compass Charter. Zechariah was introduced to me		
		by Kati and he serves with iDFY and is getting involved in MADC.
