Started his prevention career while in high school. Created the idea to educate youth on drugs and alcohol with the approach to answer the question "Why" and what happens if you start today. The goal of this approach is to reach students in the now. Using the three P's of alcohol "pee, puke, and pass out". Additional education on vaping, Jules, opioid epidemic, nutrition, gambling addiction, marijuana and screen addition. Wanted to speak to other addictions not just drug and alcohol. Online education platform: Have switched over to webinars to comply with COVID safety measures, they do not allow the students to interact with each other. Students are able to ask questions in the chat where all can see or thru the private messaging. They are getting very specific questions with the private chat. Participants do not have to register to participate in the webinar. The link is sent to the teachers and the teachers send out the link. Interactive surveys during the webinar (Modeled the webinar after <i>Good Mythical Morning</i>). If students watch the webinar after the live feed, they can still ask questions in the chat.
