	State to hold a film screening at WASD. Our goal is to have 90 people there. Free tacos for families, there will be
	gift-cards available. If parents and families come, they can talk prevention over dinner. We'll have resource
	tables, MADC will be there. Tobacco Compliance Checks, Earl and I had a conversation trying to come up with why
	we aren't doing shoulder taps with retail shops and vape shops. Federal does it in Idaho but not a lot of
	operations are being done. (Marco) A couple tobacco bills proposed, we are still working on them. (Kati) The
	language for this bill says local law enforcement can do compliance checks. Health and Welfare has an individual
	taking over the ID tobacco project, ISP gives money to this project for law enforcement to contract with them to
	do shoulder taps. (Marco) They told us, they wanted to have 17 yr olds to do shoulder taps. (Danielle) Is the
	tobacco age 21 now, right? (Earl) Yes. (Kendall) I think the bill you are referring to is <u>HB244</u> (Marco) We are still
	doing a lot of work on tobacco legislation. (Kati) It was the <u>Clean Indoor Air Act</u> . (Brenda) Do you know why there
	is opposition, and they didn't want to tax vapes? (Marco) We'll talk after. (Robert) Was there any talk about
	raising the fine higher than \$74? (Marco) Trying to move away from giving youth tickets. We don't want young
	people to get into the system. It is important with the millennium fund, to divert to community assessment
	centers. (Kendall) Similar to Alive at 25. (Robert) Alive at 25 is a diversion program. A youth gets a speeding
	violation, they take the class, and the prosecutor will usually dismiss the infraction once the youth receive the
	certification. (Marco) It's an upstream approach and Idaho is the only state doing this as a prevention technique.
	Served 3500 families. (Danielle) The youth still must choose diversion/class over a ticket/fine. (Marco) It is a



		dangling carrot, we still have charges, the prosecutor has the power. We are doing it with women incarcerated
		with substance use. 77% of women incarcerated in ID is for drug crimes. Do an alternative type of sentence.
		That's the treatment. (Robert) The kid getting a citation, is it \$1500 total cost? (Marco) Yes, once you factor
		everything else in, that is the total cost. That same \$1500 can serve one kid for 6 months through an assessment
		center. (Danielle) Northpoint is working with ID Juvenile Justice and contracting with them to work with our teen
		program. (Susie) One question, is there such a thing as a \$1500 fine for one child? (Robert) No, it is always \$74.
		(Marco) Where does that money go? What is the intervention? (Robert) No idea where it goes, unless you catch
		someone selling a vape, it's a \$200 fine. (Kendall) As far as the violations, there are classes within WASD.
		(Danielle) We contract with them as well. (Kati) Will share the link for WASD partnership. (Marco) They used to
		suspend kids, but that's not what we want.

		Marco, thank you for your prevention advocacy as well as being an advocate for youth throughout Idaho. (Marco)
		Serving on the legislature over the last couple years has been great. (Kendall) We had a question regarding the
		possession of marijuana \$300 fine and those who are 18 or younger. A person under the age of 18 would be
		petitioned for this charge in the juvenile court system rather than the adult court system. There is a potential the
		judge handling the case could enter the charge into the diversion program and the juvenile avoids penalty, but
		ultimately if the juvenile is convicted of the crime they are bound to the same criteria as an adult would be. In
		other words, they would be held to the \$300 minimum fine. (Marco) We exempted the juveniles because the law
		wouldn't have passed if they were included in there. (Earl) Is this something for first offense for juveniles?
		(Marco) it is up to the judges. (Robert) knowing the judges, it sounds like that will be the case. (Susie) is it for 18
		and under? (Marco) No 18 and older. (Earl) when I was an SRO, it seems like juveniles were just going into the



	Smokescreen Discussion	system. (Marco) The fine is now more for possession of marijuana than it is for Domestic Violence. But the goal is to show Idaho is not pro-marijuana. We just don't want a ballet initiative happening. <u>H401</u> is a Medical Marijuana bill that was introduced. (Kendall) unless anyone has any questions. I'd like to take some time to talk about <u>Smokescreen</u> . I'd like feedback on what topics you think are most important to educate constituents on. (Susie) What Marijuana has done in the communities, how they are trashed. Show adults, this is what is going to happen with legalization. The other one was the revenue. (Marco) Colorado is putting in \$8 in for every dollar going out.					
		(Kati) These other states, the cost of the social aspect is far higher than what the state could achieve. Impaired driving accidents, mental health outcomes, and the black market stuck out to me. Dispensaries setup, but it increases the black market in those locations. (Anne) it makes them produce more because the price goes down. (Jake) what today's marijuana actually is. I have a relative that smokes regularly. He is dealing with medical issues but smoking gives him 'relief'. My family members do not understand what today's marijuana is and how potent it is. I don't think people understand that marijuana today is an entirely different breed. The kids are going to hit a					
		90% concentrate. (Robert) That's why students have seizures and vomit in school. (Jake) my relative has epilepsy, and smokes because of that. People truly believe there is no correlation between seizures and smoking. (Danielle) And it's 'non-addictive' according to what people say. (Marco) They finally are acknowledging there is psychosis.
