3:05	Kendall: trailer walk through & program discussion	(Kendall) We are excited to show the trailer. Most of the props are placed in the trailer but we brought the extras in for you to look at. We're curious to see what your thoughts are. We're looking for feedback on ways to show different educational materials on the walls. We have info on new vape trends, different marijuana topics, bulletins, etc. If you have other ideas or things you see in the schools let us know. I It's that time of year when

	trailer feedback	MADC annual calendar for 2025 has been updated as well. (Earl) I like the wrap of the trailer, a lot of 3D images, it looks good. (Danielle) Maybe having Vicks and discussing its association with use of MDMA? Or hiding things inside the pillowcase? (Tiffany) In the back of a canvas painting, a lot of students hide things there. (Caylee) What about including a Prime energy drink with the energy drinks? (Kati) Placing eyeliner or makeup next to a vape / including some fishing gear or outdoorsy stuff? (Kendall) Any thoughts/suggestions on how to optimize it for WASD? (David) Is there anything our officers are seeing? With juveniles in their rooms? Make it realistic for this area and this generation. (Earl) Usually officers don't go through the rooms when they are on scene. (Kendall) Good question. Robert came and sat with us, the SRO team will give us some good ideas and feedback as well. We conduct prevention updates twice a year, if officers see things that are impactful, we can include them. (Danielle) You guys did great. The set-up is realistic. (Earl) Educational info for parents will be

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helpful. Don't make it too small, you want to be able to read it. (Kati) What about a key? (Hailey) We thought of creating a form of some kind with either a key, mix and match, or can you find this item? What are your thoughts on that? (Danielle) What about how many concealments can we find? (Susie) I have no idea what to look for. Give parents an idea, hidden compartments. (Yoonwa) It should be something they can take home, so they know what to look for. (Kati) Key to take home, prevention measure/advice/resource on what parents can do if they find their child with those items. (David) Tools for parents to talk to their kids, having conversations. (Kendall) When we received the trailer the walls had multiple inspirational sayings for parents, reminders to meet their child where they're at. The goal is to open conversations in a supportive collaborative way. We plan to include a QR to the Parent Prevention Packet booklet and maybe the Operation Parent Handbook. (Hailey) We looked into getting a quote for the Operation Parent Handbooks, and it is \$23,000 for 1K of each. We are looking at getting funds donated. (Yoonwa) Do you have the funding for the ODP grant? (Kendall) We're on hold for spending. We do have some funding for our bi-yearly alcohol compliance checks. (Yoonwa) I think there could be a space to fund these booklets. (Kendall) We've had some changes at the city level when it comes to grants, so we will keep that in mind. (Kendall) Caylee, do you have any thoughts from a youth's perspective? How to make it an optimal learning activity? (Caylee) I think the parent and kid could walk through together. But then the parents can go solo afterwards to ask questions. (Danielle) Do you think kids would go in to get ideas? (Hailey) Do you think it could be a case-by- case basis? For example, you encounter parents and kids that can think this is a joke, if that were the case it wouldn't be appropriate for the kids to come inside. (Kati) Yes. That could be an issue. For example, I had a parent say in front of me I don't care if you vape because it's not that big of a deal. (Danielle) Age limit? (Earl) Gear it towards a younger age. May not be the right learning environment for high-school parents. (Kati) We're seeing young kids (elementary age) getting started with using different substances. (Hailey) I don't want to scare any kids. (Kendall) A lot of youth are intimidated before going to middle-school. (David) I don't think I've ever seen kids going through a trailer like that before. It's too easy to give them ideas. Sneaking off with items. (Hailey) We're thinking we're going to have at least 4 people working the trailer. (David) Control the number of people going through each time. (Kati) Maybe sign-in sheet before they enter, just in case. (Kendall) Sign-in so we have a contact form. (Earl) At least 3-4 people. (Danielle) I'd say minimum 1-2. (Hailey) A staff or volunteer inside there always. (Kendall) Parents only seems like a good point, same with the sign-in sheet. (Earl) Leave it adults only for the first year. (Hailey) We can have an activity for kids outside the trailer to keep them busy. (Danielle) Legos - It will keep them busy for hours! (Kati) Tailor it, it could be an activity related to coping skills. (Danielle) Lego store may donate. (Kendall)

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		Anything for WASD? (Yoonwa) Are we keeping that scene constant? For example, maybe we could have a scenario set up for teachers/educators. (Kendall) There is a desk to customize an area for school admin. Maybe we can do a mock-classroom. (Earl) Showing how kids are using in schools. That is a great idea. (Yoonwa) I still think educators would benefit from it. (Danielle) Calling out the name brands. (Kendall) Any drug that you think is trending? (Danielle) [Cocaine] is trending. (Kati) Adderall. (Earl) Other substances that are not classified as illegal. Kratom. (Danielle) Kava. (Kendall) Those topics can be included on the poster boards. (Danielle) There's a store in Boise, advertising one shot of Kratom. (Yoonwa) Vapes being advertised as "Healthy"? (Kati) Fum? (Hailey) There's solace vapes in there and those are "zero-nicotine" energy vapes. (Kati) Vapes that are essential oils only. (Caylee) Security cameras in there? (Hailey) Maybe some wireless cameras? (Kati) At least a sign saying you're on camera. (Hailey) Smile you're on camera.
